

Family: Roots, Restore, Revive - Week 7

| SCRIPTURE

“At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, “Who, then, is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?” He called a little child to him, and placed the child among them. And he said: “Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. | KEY THOUGHTS

- Children are Jesus’s example of lifelong faith and the responsibility of a lifelong follower.
- Things that hinder passing the gospel between the generations: indifference, intimidation, immaturity, immorality, and unbelief.
- Problem: To hinder, and not welcome, the next generation to Jesus puts us at odds with God’s plan and slowly robs purpose from our life.
- Grownups must pass down the Gospel to the next generation.
- Grownups must build bridges and remove obstacles for young people to get to and be like Jesus.

| APPLICATION

- Obstacle 1: Remove human religion.
- Obstacle 2: Remove cultural idols.
- Bridge 1: Between parents and their children.
- Bridge 2: Between the older and younger generations.

| REFLECTION

- How have you seen indifference, intimidation, immaturity, immorality, and unbelief block your relationship with the next generation?
- How can you remove the obstacles in your life that block your relationship with the next generation?
- How can you build bridges in your life with the next generation?
